1409 - Sibling Rivals . . . Wilhelm Friedemann Bach was reputed the finest organist of his era, he died penniless while his younger brother, Carl Philip Emmanuel Bach, prospered as harpsichordist to Frederick the Great and later as the Music Director for the city of Hamburg.

1410 - March Marches . . . getting in step with some bracing tunes that will keep you in good spirits and on the move!

1411 - Bach Alive . . . concert performances of music by the greatest composer for the pipe organ, in celebration of his birthday and the beginning of spring.

1412 - Conventional Wisdom: *A Chicago Collection* . . . unique recital performances from the 2006 National Convention of the American Guild of Organists.

1413 - From Harvard Yard . . . a visit to Memorial Church to hear the new gallery organ by C. B. Fisk, the renewed 1930 Skinner organ in Appleton Chapel, and some historic resonances of instruments from the past.
