INVITATION

Dear Pipedreams Pals,

Would you believe that this will be PIPE-DREAMS Tour Number Thirteen!? I hope that's not an unlucky number, but it does attest to thirteen years of intense, exciting, game-changing group adventures in the world of the



pipe organ! Some of you have participated in nearly all of these, some of you were first-timers last year, and some of you may have evidenced interest and curiosity, but have not previously been able to join us. Now is the year, I hope!

Even before we had begun the previous tour, members of the group already were asking 'what's next?'... and though I had some ideas then, I couldn't make up my mind. But I had been impressed by some recordings featuring an excellent young Belgian recitalist who now lives in Switzerland, **Els Biesemans** (www.elsbiesemans.be), and discovered her to be quite intrigued by our project and able to collaborate with me in its creation.

We will travel the length and breadth of Switzerland, from Zurich to Geneva, Lausanne to Leuk, through breath-taking scenery of lakes and mountains, while experiencing a most comprehensive history of the pipe organ, from its medieval beginnings to its present-day representatives.

In addition to the world's oldest pipe organ and other famous historic instruments by Silbermann and Bossard we'll investigate Swiss-made installations by Mooser, Carlen, Mathis, Metzler, Goll, and Kuhn, plus the largest American-built organ in Europe, by Fisk.

A special PIPEDREAMS broadcast in December ("A Swiss Mix" #1348) should whet your curiosity and introduce you to the incredible variety of Swiss pipe organs and the music composed for them. But that is only a taste. As we have learned, nothing equals the in-person experience of a pipe organ, as the cultural contexts and architectural environments in which these instruments live greatly enhance one's understanding and appreciation of them. Switzerland is a multi-cultural country, with strong influences from France, Germany and Italy, and because of its neutrality and prosperity, virtually every church or civic building houses a pipe organ. Our biggest challenge was determining what not to see.

As usual, comfortable shoes are a necessity, and you should be prepared to walk some distances, since several venues will not allow our coach up-close access. Typically, some days will be packed with activities, but we've also attempted to provide a bit more 'free time' for your own individual explorations. Also, feel free to come early or stay late if you are enticed by other involvements beyond those we've planned, as there is much to savor in Switzerland!

This will be my first visit to Switzerland, so each day will be rich with discoveries for me, and for you, too, I trust. I hope you will be able to join our crew for this wonderful experience. Make your reservations now... don't delay!

MON 12 MAY Depart U.S.

Fly non-stop, overnight from JFK or Chicago O'Hare to Zurich via Swiss Airlines. (Meals inflight)

TUE 13 MAY Arrive Zurich/Basel

Upon arrival in Zurich this morning, meet your professional tour manager for the transfer to Basel. The first visit in Switzerland takes place at the Basel Münster. Built on a hill overlooking the Rhine, the church adorns the city with its red sandstone walls, colorful roof tiles and twin towers. After hotel check-in gather for a welcome dinner. THU 15 MAY Basel/Biel

Depart Basel with visits to village instruments on the way to Biel. Of particular note is the organ at the former monastic church in St. Urban. The bold vaults above the two side windows and their interplay with the pipework of the Pedal Organ is a masterpiece in organ building and architecture. Mercure Plaza (B, D)

Travel to Lausanne on Lake Geneva, stopping in Payerne and Fribourg en route. The former abbey church in Payerne dates from the 11th century and is the monumental Romanesque center of a quaint Medieval old town. Journey to Geneva today then into the hills to charming Romainmôtier. Gently sloping vine-yards border the shores of Lake Geneva and small wine-growing villages dot the countryside. The Cathedral of St. Peter in Geneva is best known as the church where John Calvin gave his inspiring sermons during the mid-16th century. *Hotel Lavaux* (B)

YOUR HOSTS

MICHAEL BARONE is a well known voice on public radio as host for national broadcasts of American Public Media's Pipedreams®, which celebrated its 30th anniversary in 2012. He came to Minnesota Public Radio in 1968, served as the system's music director through 1993, and continues as a Senior Executive Producer.

Barone is a graduate (B.M. in Music History) of the Oberlin Conservatory in Ohio, and an internationally known advocate for the pipe organ and its music. He has received special honors from the American Guild of Organists, the Organ Historical Society, the American Society of Composers, Authors and Publishers (ASCAP), and the Minnesota Music Hall of Fame for his contributions to the musical community at large and to organ music in particular.

ELS BIESEMANS was born in Antwerp and is at home on a number of different keyboard instruments, performing concerts on the clavichord, fortepiano, modern concert grand piano, harpsichord, and organ in most European countries, Japan, Canada and the US.



She received a Master's degree in music performance majoring in piano, organ and chamber music at the Lemmens Institute in Leuven, Belgium. She subsequently completed advanced studies in fortepiano (Jesper Christensen) and organ (Andrea Marcon, Wolfgang Zerer) at the Schola Cantorum Basiliensis in Basel, Switzerland.
